
Edmonds Underwater Park



Edmonds Underwater Park is a fun and easy dive. The site is a little current sensitive so watch the current tables. There is a ferry terminal just to the left of the dive site. Dive within 100 yards of the ferry terminal and you'll get to meet all sorts of interesting people in uniform and probably get the opportunity to replace the dive gear they've confiscated. There is a large rope/cable on the bottom so there's really no reason to get that close.

This is a shallow dive. If your computer says 40 feet you there's a good chance you've wandered out of the park. The depth changes so gradually that you'll want to practice your navigation skills. Make sure you take a compass heading before going out so you'll know the way home.

The park has a lot of underwater structures including sunken ships, pipes, and a maze of fences. There are maps available and the park is laid out in grids with ropes. The main attraction is the sea life. You never know what you'll see here. We've had a sea lion come up to us and blow bubbles in our face. We've also seen birds (cormorants) "flying" by us in 30 fsw. There are freakishly large Ling Cod and Cabezon. Be careful of these from December through March. They get very territorial while guarding their nests.
